# 3. Purple Heron Ardea purpurea

Site location: Canale Bogina, Viadana (Mantova),

**Notes of the observers:** During three years of heronry survey, we observed a total of 14 nests located between 8-15 m on poplars *Populus* spp. The nests were located in a Grey Heron *Ardea cinerea* heronry, hosting ca. 55 Grey Heron nests.

Reasons of interest: Purple and Grey herons usually segregate completely at the nest site, by breeding in different subcolonies when they co-occur in a heronry, or by nesting at different heights, or by species turnover when separate subcolonies are not available. Despite the presence of reedbeds in the same spot, we found, in 3 year of monitoring, only 2 nests in reedbeds and 5 on bushes. 28 nests were at a height of 8-15 m: 14 on Mulberry *Morus* spp. and Pedunculate Oak *Quercus robur* and the other 14 on Poplar *Populus* spp.

**Reasons of interest:** The Rosy Starling is an irruptive migrant in Italy. However, there are few observations reported for Valtellina (Sondrio).
